Theory of breakthrough

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From strength to strength - over a decade of capacity development and knowledge management


- Value proposition is anchored to the wealth of knowledge the Programme has generated since 2008.
- Combination of in-country presence and global reach allow for the scaling up of local experiences into global lessons and good practices.
- Core strengths:
 - Unparalleled expertise
 - Knowledge broker
 - Catalytic convener

A new approach for improved CDKM

- New approach made necessary by:
 - urgency in pivoting from readiness to scaled up financing and implementation
 - partner countries' raised ambitions
 - partner donors diversifying contributions
- Annual thematic priorities will guide all global outputs
- Linkages to, and leverage of, the knowledge of external partners
- Outputs follow a *knowledge journey* and are connected, coherent and sequenced
- Aligns with the Programme's intervention principles:
 - speed, flexibility and scale



The **Theory of Breakthrough** builds on the idea of an intrinsically linked three-step *knowledge journey* from knowledge generation to knowledge exchange and knowledge-based advocacy.



Objective

Outcomes 1-3 achieved through a necessary and significant CDKM contribution that transmits knowledge and capacity to key constituencies that can operate policy and finance levers of breakthrough.

- Capacitate REDD+ practitioners
- Advocate for forest solutions by informing decision-makers
- Establish UN-REDD as CDKM go-to hub on REDD+






